



GUSRC Student Teaching Awards 2017/18 Nomination Guidelines

These guidelines are to help you consider why you want to nominate your teacher/tutor/student representative. For all nominations remember:

- **Include examples** of what your nominee has done to deserve this award!
- It's **quality over quantity** so we're looking for why they deserve the award **not** how many nominations they get.
- Remember the **support staff** category can include anyone from around the university that have gone out of their way to help you- from janitorial staff and lab techs, to counsellors or security.
- Nominate as many times as you want for as many different teachers you like!

Questions to think about when writing your nominations:

- Why did this person go above and beyond any other?
- What will you remember them for?
- What makes them stand out?
- Have they made a topic easier to understand?
- Have they gone above and beyond their remit?
- Have they given you great advice when you needed it most?
- Have you got a truly inspirational supervisor?
- Have they helped you through good times or bad times?
- Have you had a brilliant tutor for your seminars and tutorials?
- Do they make the unbearable bearable?
- Have they gotten you excited about your chosen topic?
- Do they challenge and inspire you?

Category clarification:

Best Online Learning Experience– this is open to interpretation, but consider....

- Moodle, mahara, big blue button, skype, other online platforms that have really changed your learning
- Also think about innovative ways online courses/ elements of online courses that have been particularly effective
- You may also consider the support which staff have given with an online course
- You could include ways Moodle has been used well

Best Student Representative:

- This could be either a class representative or an SRC council member who has gone above and beyond within their remit.
- Consider any student who has made a significant change to your course!
