# GU CLUB & SOCIETY VOLUNTEERING COMMUNITY OUTREACH AWARD

Commending a club or society's partnership and involvement with Glasgow's local community and recognising the positive impact our students are having beyond our campuses.

#### **GU BASKETBALL CLUB'S SOCIAL OUTREACH PROGRAMME**



This year saw the take-off of Glasgow University Basketball Club's Social Outreach Programme. The programme aims to encourage young people from Govan to play basketball, get into the sport and think about higher education. Working with P5's to S4's it covers a variety of age groups and levels of ability. Volunteers from the Men and Women's basketball teams, along with other keen members of the basketball community trained up over 20 basketball coaches/volunteers. These volunteers go out and provide weekly coaching hosting tournaments and events for over 350 kids in the Govan area. These kids have improved their basketball abilities massively and have even had the opportunity to compete wearing Glasgow university strips. The positive impact goes beyond the court as many of the kids impacted by this programme are given an insight into further education.

#### **STAR**



Student Action for Refugees run a weekly conversational club with refugees and asylum seekers based at the nearby Maryhill Integration Network. Volunteers are made up of Glasgow University students and the aim is for refugees and asylum seekers from the local area to practice and improve their English skills, as well as meet new people and create friendships. STAR have also been heavily involved in several campaigns across the year including the 'No Evictions Campaign', 'Equal Access', '15





by 30 campaign', and petitioned for the refugee family reunification bill. On top of all that, they are currently in discussion with the University to see if becoming a University of Sanctuary would be possible. In doing so, they have started the conversation to make the University as welcoming and accessible for refugees as possible.

#### **SAVE A BABY'S LIFE**



Across the year this society has been campaigning and raising awareness on how to save lives. This year over 80 students have taken part and trained in affiliation with the Royal Lifesaving Society UK to become a community instructor. This training allows students the opportunity to teach paediatric first aid, including CPR, choking and drowning prevention. The society organises visits throughout the year in the community, where students go and teach parents with young children these first aid skills, allowing them to practise on the baby manikins and providing confidence and assurance of what to do in the event of their baby stopping breathing. Not only are they having the chance to meet new people out in the community but they are also sharing life-saving skills.

#### **FEMENG**



As Glasgow University's Female Engineering society, FemEng is a student network which aims to tackle the gender imbalance within engineering and its effects on students, the younger generation, and industry professionals. They are passionate about promoting STEM to the wider community, and volunteer in primary and secondary schools across Glasgow to do informative presentations, science fairs, and host interactive fun workshops teaching children about STEM. They hope to inspire the next generation of children into a career in STEM and act as role models to young females.



#### **GU CLUB OR SOCIETY EVENT OF THE YEAR**

This is an award for the club or society which has put on a special event, one that has impacted others, encouraged participation, and one that has positively influenced and impacted on the university community.

#### **VEGAN FRESHERS' FAIR**



To kick start their year, the Vegan Society held a Food Fair during Freshers' Week. The Vegan Society embodies the values of veganism and aims to share those values with members and non-members alike. Through this food fair they utilised donations from a number of different companies and managed to giveaway an amazing amount of free plant-based food. Especially in 2019, the year of sustainability and action for climate change this event was extremely exciting and inspired not just freshers but students from all years. With queues out the door, this event was a highlight to many who visited the campus during Freshers' Week.

#### **STAG NIGHTS: FANTASY**



An incredible, three-night theatre festival showcasing nine original student plays, this year's STAG Nights was an immersive event that truly showcased what STAG has to offer. Going through various challenges including a leak in the venue threatening to stop the event, it became clear this was the best one yet. Countless people got involved, and every single person put in a massive amount of effort to make STAG Nights 2019: Fantasy an unforgettable experience from writers, directors, actors, stage managers and the rest of the backstage team, technical support, and venue designers everyone had to pull together to create this event.



#### **GU MARY'S MEALS BURNS CEILIDH**



This Burns Night Mary's Meals hosted a ceilidh in the Glasgow University Union. Hitting capacity early in the evening, every level of ability was welcome to attend the event. Aside from the hours of dancing, which at one point saw attendees doing the strip the willow out the doors of the debate chambers and across the hall of the GUU, there was also snacks and a glitter stall available as well as a tempting raffle with prizes including kayak and escape room experiences. While a great deal of fun was had by hundreds of members of the university, at the heart of the event was the charity the society works to support- Mary's Meals. In total, the event raised a huge £1514.45 for the charity, a sum which will allow the charity to feed another 108 children for a whole year.

#### **GUCFS JAILBREAK**



For the third time, GUCFS ran their Jailbreak. The main objective of this event sees teams of students compete to get as far as possible away from the university in 36hrs, without spending any money on transport. In return, the teams receive sponsorship donations from friends, family and the public, all of which go to support GUCFS' annual charity partner. This year the event raised a huge £5,359 for the charity with nine teams taking on the challenge. The winning team managed to get 3693km away to Cyprus but by the end of the weekend, there were teams dotted all over the map in Poland, Portugal, Spain, Mallorca and Italy. This event allows students to challenge themselves and try something completely new whilst also generating coverage for GUCFS and Glasqow's Women's Aid.

#### GU CLUB OR SOCIETY WORKING TOGETHER AWARD

This marks the achievements of a club or society who have collaborated with another group or individual. It could be either a longstanding partnership, a joint initiative or a collaborative event with both other clubs and societies or external companies.

#### **GU SOUTH ASIAN SOCIETY**



GU South Asian Society have worked diligently across the past year to collaborate with other societies here at Glasgow. Particularly their partnership with the GU Alexandrian Society has showcased the very best that can happen when societies come together. Bringing people together and sharing resources has benefited the society as new friendships and an increased range of events they can facilitate and put on has occurred. From a charity Diwali Karaoke night with the Beatson cancer charity to a film screening with the Disney Society, GU South Asian Society's connections have brought so much to their members and the members of the societies they have collaborated with.

#### **GU GERMAN SOCIETY**



Across the year the German Society has not only made efforts to further support and hold events for its members and community of German speakers, students, or otherwise interested people but also to foster connections with other societies. Throughout the year, GUGS has organised smaller events such as a combined "Stammtisch" and a Pub Quiz with the GU Italian Society, or a movie night with GIST. However, the partnership to other language societies has been particularly successful, bringing to life events such as the GU Football World Cup, the Languages Subcrawl or a reggeaton party in connection to the Guy Fawkes Fireworks during the past semester, as well as the Cultural Ceilidh. Furthermore, GUGS is constantly working to uphold its





partnership with the Goethe Institut, of which there are only two in the UK. Through this partnership our members are made aware of and profit from the Institut's own events and resources.

#### **GU SCOTTISH COUNTRY DANCE CLUB**



This society has started a new initiative this year to help other societies run their ceilidhs successfully by offering their experience in finding venues, by recommending bands suited to the societies needs and budgets, and offering their members to come along as demonstration dancers, callers, or general help in making the night a success. This has encouraged further collaboration and communication between GUSCDC and a variety of other societies and the student bodies across campus.

#### **GLASGOW MARROW**




For the fourth year in a row, Glasgow Marrow has collaborated with various Glasgow University-based sports teams to produce an annual Naked Calendar in aid of Anthony Nolan. This year Glasgow Marrow recruited the highest total amount of teams that have ever taken part in the calendar, collaborating with 14 sports teams in total! Continuing this yearly collaboration truly epitomises the commitment and drive from the Glasgow Marrow committee to continue these long-lasting relationships and coordinate the calendar every year. In addition to the sports teams, Glasgow Marrow also collaborated alongside the Glasgow Uni branch of CoppaFeel in this year's Naked Calendar, making the month of October on the calendar Breast Cancer Awareness month, with the Women's Volleyball team proudly wearing CoppaFeel stickers during the shoots that are visible in the calendar pictures.

#### **FILM SOCIETY**



The Film Society is seen as the perfect opportunity for students to come together to both enrich their academic experiences and have a place to socialise and meet other students with similar interests. Specifically looking at showing lesser-known films the society has diversity goals put in place to screen movies with LGBTQ+ characters, non-white and non-male directors, and movies in non-English languages. With a constantly high attendance and socials to complement the screenings, there is plenty of chances to get involved.

#### Ñ DE ESPAÑA



Creating a home from home, this society celebrates and enhances the student experience and creates a community of Spanish students and speakers here at the University of Glasgow. Getting involved in sharing traditions from Spain all whilst exploring the local culture, this society is a welcoming group of students that are going from strength to strength.



#### **WALKING SOCIETY**



Providing students with the chance to explore Scotland, the walking society have been dedicated to getting members of the student body walking all across Scotland. From the Falls of Clyde to Bothwell Castle Walks they have created a welcoming society that caters for all levels of fitness. They have also introduced First Aid courses alongside socials and exam de-stress events to provide a wide range of opportunities and skills to its members.

#### **WAR FILM SOCIETY**



Following the need to provide a social element to their degree this society was started by a group of master's students looking to expand their understanding whilst also getting to know each other better. Each week following a film screening there is often in-depth discussions not just about the action of wars, but also the impact on peoples lived experiences. Expanding more with new members this society has not only provided a chance to meet outside a film theatre but is also benefiting the member's academic studies.



# GU CAMPUS VOLUNTEERING STUDENT COMMUNITY

Recognising a student's or group of students' achievements to volunteering on a University of Glasgow Campus. They have demonstrated a desire to go above and beyond in volunteering on campus helping their fellow peers.

#### **BETH LEISHMAN**



Beth has been a dedicated Volunteer of the SRC's "Mind Your Mate: Suicide Prevention Workshops" since 2018. She co-delivers the three-hour workshops teaching her peers about basic mental health awareness; demystifies myths surrounding suicide; outlines potential warning signs that a friend is at risk and offers practical examples of how you can prevent suicides. Advocating for better mental health awareness across campus the workshops put on help destigmatise and provide students with the skills to better understand some of the issues Mental Health can create.

#### LET'S TALK WORKSHOP TRAINERS



The volunteers who deliver the "Let's Talk about Sexual Violence" workshops, in partnership with GUSRC and Rape Crisis Scotland, provide a safe space for students





to discuss sexual violence. Topics covered include the impacts of sexual violence; survivors' stories, and ways to build a supportive community; consent; bystander intervention; and where to find support. For a topic that has been increasingly under the spotlight, these volunteers have helped deliver more workshops than ever this year, educating increased numbers of the student population with each volunteer showing the greatest levels of patience and empathy.

#### PHILINE VON HIRSCHHEYDT AND SOFIA COSTA ERIKSSON



The Glasgow University Environmental Task Force (GUETF) was formed in early 2019, as a means of developing a more positive student identity in the West End. Teaming up with Glasgow City Council, local initiatives like Friends of the River Kelvin and the wider community, students work shoulder-to-shoulder with local residents to help make Glasgow a greener, cleaner place for everyone. In November, our GUETF volunteers took part in a national campaign to plant one million trees across the UK: organised by the Woodland Trust, the UK's largest woodland conservation charity. Over 2,600 trees were planted in students' efforts to help tackle climate change, offsetting 650 metric tons of carbon per year, equivalent to the annual carbon impact of the non-recyclable waste produced by the University. As Co-Convenors of the GUETF, Philine and Sofia have been nominated for their commitment to its activities, as well as their enthusiasm and efforts towards sustainability and the environment.

#### **GU CLUB OR SOCIETY MEMBER OF THE YEAR**

Recognising and celebrating students who have shown a tremendous commitment and contribution to their club or society throughout the academic year.

#### **KETONG ZHANG**



The President of the Glasgow Chinese Students and Scholars Association, Ketong is constantly looking at new ways on how to get people involved in the society and celebrate his culture. He is always on hand to support and talk to any members of his society as well as students who approach him with any concerns. He has organised numerous events throughout the year such as the celebration of the 70th anniversary of the founding of the PRC or Chinese Culture Week. As one of Glasgow Marrow's Donor Recruitment Coordinators Mark is involved in signing up volunteers and co-ordinating the societies outreach through stalls, flyering or lecture shout-outs. This year he has played a key part in Glasgow Marrow having 214 people being signed up to the stem cell register in one week. He also took on the task of coordinating the "Glasgow Goes Dating" event raising awareness across campus. He is an inspiration to his fellow committee members and a motivator for all Glasgow Marrow volunteers

### GU CLUB OR SOCIETY CHARITABLE GIVING AWARD

#### **GU MUSLIM STUDENT ASSOCIATION**



This year GUMSA got involved in a charity week raising money for orphans and children in need around the world to aid in various campaigns for these children such as food, education, providing water and/or medical supplies. Members were involved in running events, putting on bake sales or collecting donations across campus and the city. They have also continued their hard work in raising awareness at their events across the year including that of their Interfaith dinner that saw over 200 members of staff and students attend to celebrate equality and diversity.

#### **MACMILLAN**



Macmillian is a long-standing presence here at Glasgow University promoting the hard work of Macmillan Cancer Support. With their glitter stands at Hive, their annual face-painting at the GUU St Paddy's day celebrations, the ceilidhs they put on and their famously good bake sales, they strive to raise as much money as possible for a fantastic charity that maintains its brilliant reputation. The committee continues to go above and beyond with members looking forward to walking 23 miles in the upcoming kilt walk over the next few months.



#### **GU CHARITY FASHION SHOW**



Currently in its sixth year, GUCFS is one of the most recognisable societies on campus. This year GUCFS' fundraising events have placed Glasgow Women's Aid (their charity partner) and all of the issues surrounding domestic abuse at the very core and used these to promote the issue to students while spreading awareness of the charity. Particular events that have stood out include Walk A Mile, which encouraged participants to swap shoes with someone else to promote the importance of understanding what it's like to see things from another person's point of view. This year they have also taken the next natural step by putting on two shows, rather than one for students and the general public to attend expanding on previous years efforts and building a sustainable format for future years.

#### **GU MARY'S MEALS**



GU Mary's Meals have been raising money to provide children in areas of poverty all over the world with a meal a day in a place of education, the aim of which is to keep the children in school while tackling the major issues surrounding poverty and starvation. Over the past five years, the society has continuously put on events and fundraisers to engage as many students as possible about their cause. From their super successful ceilidh to individual membership challenges such as living on beans and rice for a week they are constantly looking at how to raise more money and awareness year upon year.

### Feel Good February

'Feel Good February' campaign is a month dedicated to raising awareness and decreasing the stigma around mental health. It is a month of activities that are led by GUVMA, but has a cross-campus approach, utilising not only the student bodies but allowing clubs and societies to get involved also. Events throughout the month events include Motivational Mondays - where current students, graduated vets and members of staff willingly submit stories of how they overcame challenges through a motivational email that gets circulated throughout the entire student body. Tea Tuesdays, Throwback Thursdays and lastly, Freebie Fridays where mental health resources (i.e. notepads with important contact numbers etc...) are circulated through the whole vet school. It is a fantastic initiative that opens up the conversation about mental health while uniting students within the vet school with others in the university and wider world.

#### **GLASGOW STUDENT DANCE COMPANY - CONFIDENCE AND DIVERSITY**



This year GSDC launched their confidence and diversity campaign encouraging people to get involved and feel comfortable in classes and on the stage. The campaign celebrates the different talents and backgrounds of everyone and shows that you don't have to be a professional dancer of 10 years to be able to do it. It also looked at societal expectations, particularly when looking at body image. Everyone involved has got behind this initiative creating an empowered group of students who support each other inside and outside the classroom.



#### GLASGOW UNIVERSITY GAME DESIGN AND DEVELOPMENT SOCIETY -DEVELOP YOUR OWN GAME



From October the GUDEV society has been creating a game from scratch. The game development is done mostly exclusively during dedicated weekly development sessions lasting around 3 hours and are open to anyone to come in and contribute to the project. The idea behind the project stemmed from previously attempted yearlong developments. This academic year the society looked back and reflected why the attempt was unsuccessful, learning from it and bringing forward a new plan of how to run the project. Creating a game from scratch allows members involved to exercise new skills from programming to art, music and writing, which tend to require a different approach in game development than in other applications. The project benefits greatly from multidisciplinary teamwork.

#### **SUCCESSFUL WOMEN AT GLASGOW - SAFETY ON CAMPUS**



In light of the incidents that occurred around the West End in November, SWAG showed an outpouring of love and support to those who had been affected. This kick-started and encouraged a partnership with Glasgow and Clyde Rape Crisis. Initiatives such as walking buses, support pages and signposting were all actively promoted around campus and on social media. Even tonight they are continuing this campaign with a Fight for the Night march. The society's empathetic and dedicated response to the safety of others highlighted some of the very best that students have to offer.

## GU VOLUNTEER & WORLD CHANGER OF THE YEAR

#### **ALISON NOBLE**



Alison has been an active member of the student community over her time here at Glasgow. Back in her first and second years, she volunteered with GUSH and Conversational English Mentoring which sparked her interest in student giving. Working as part of the Future World Changers programme she has been trying to work towards her goal of increasing student philanthropy on campus. This year she has taken on her own project which she calls 'Campush'. She is attempting to get a round-up digital donation system on to campus so that giving back to the surrounding community and the world can become an integral part of student life and hopes one day this can be a nation-wide University initiative. Her encouragement of all members of the student community to get involved in giving back is crucial and highlights her dedication to bettering the lives of the people around her.

#### **KIERAN DOWLING**



Kieran Dowling has spent the greater part of the last two years creating the Govan school of basketball social outreach programme. As the student lead of the





programme, Kieran has helped recruit 20 basketball players and put them through coaching training before allocating them schools to coach basketball. The programme has gone on to influence over 350 kids from the local area with the potential for the outreach to grow year upon year. Kieran has an ability to keep people motivated and keen due to his charisma and enthusiasm. He has put everything into this and is positively impacting the people around him daily.

#### **ANUSHKA NARGUND**



Anushka stepped into the role of internal coordinator for GU Nightline in September. From the moment she was in the position she has ensured continuity and clarity of direction for her volunteers. Organising and line managing a team of volunteers is no easy task, but Anushka has supported the work of Nightline both internally and more recently externally also. She actively checks in with the volunteers personally and goes the extra mile for them. Over the year she has stepped up when people have left and ensure the service provided has remained available to the students who need it most.

#### **A CAPPELLA SOCIETY**



Now in its third year, the A Cappella Society has created a new, entirely unique spot for music on campus. Going from strength to strength this year the Acapella society took their talents all the way to the Scottish Championships representing the University against their Scottish counterparts. An incredibly talented and passionate group, the society has developed not only its competitive nature but expanded to a wider social group that allows members with a wide range of vocal abilities to try acapella. #### **GLASGOW STUDENT DANCE COMPANY**



Glasgow Student Dance Company is an established society on campus that boost over 180 members being taught in 24 different classes and styles of dance. The society is continually growing and working to create accessible and inclusive classes for all abilities. From flash mobs to masterclasses and charity performances, GSDC is willing to perform everywhere from other clubs/society's events to even performances in the iconic cloisters. All their hard work accumulated in their February Dance show. A true team effort, GSDC is known as being welcoming and diverse. The implementation of their "Confidence and Diversity in Dance" campaign highlights the efforts that have gone into welcoming every one of every level of ability to the society. Not only do they showcase their talents around campus, but they have also travelled across the country representing the University of Glasgow brilliantly at many national competitions.



#### **UG RACING**



A unique and specialised society, UG Racing provide an educational experience to its members through the design, manufacturing and the racing of a single-seat formula-style racing car. This year the society has looked into becoming more accessible running a pioneering campaign to encourage access for disabled people in the world of motorsport winning them third place at the international IMechE Formula Student Business Strategy Award out of over 150 entries. They have also begun to race in international competitions as only one of only two Universities from the UK to race at the Formula Student Germany event this coming summer. This society provides hands-on experience in a highly competitive and realistic environment allowing for the development of engineering skills for all their student members.

#### **GU MARY'S MEALS**



One of our most recognisable charity societies on campus, Mary's meals members can be seen around campus in their bright blue tops. With a relatively small membership, the society sees some incredibly dedicated efforts. Four years ago the society made £1700 as their fundraising total, however this year they almost matched that from one event showing just how much they have progressed in recent years. To increase the amount raised the society has held a diverse range of events and this is reflected in innovative ideas and determined attitudes to create awareness for the charity. From traditional bake sales to pancake days, glitter stalls and a church event where they sought daffodils, this reflects their commitment to reach out to the wider community to help further the support for the charity.
